

PE REPORT TO MOULTON PRIMARY SCHOOL GOVERNING BODY May 21st 2015

P.E.S.S.P (PE and School Sport Premium)

The school is given £10,000 to spend per annum.

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

For example, you can use your funding to:

- hire specialist PE teachers
- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change 4 life clubs
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools

Moulton Primary school has used the funding the following 3 areas:

- To raise participation in extra-curricular clubs
- To improve the quality of P.E taught within the school
- To increase participation in School Sport Competition

To raise participation in extra-curricular clubs.

We targeted the following groups:

- Children below A.R.E (Age Related Expectations)
- Pupil Premium Children Years 2 and KS2
- KS2 to raise participation

We specifically offered clubs that focused upon basic fundamental skills and activities that were less mainstream to engage children who might be discouraged with mainstream sports and activities.

The PESSP has funded additional coaches from Team Fundamentals to deliver a Multi skills club, Dodge ball clubs and Frisbee clubs before and after school. This has meant that a larger range of free clubs are on offer for the children to access.

Summary

Last year 141 children attended an extra-curricular club. This year 186 have attended a club. We are already looking to begin to add in an additional gymnastics club for Year 1 and EYFS to raise the participation levels in these year groups.

Next Steps

- 1) Conduct pupil interviews with a range of children to determine the impact of these clubs upon the children with regards to:
 - Enjoyment of clubs
 - Future and continued participation of sports in and outside of school
 - Any Impact it may have had upon other areas of the curriculum
- 2) Deploy Sports leaders to organize mini activities during lunch time to increase participation of children in all areas.

To improve the quality of P.E taught within the school

Members of staff have attended a range of P.E courses in order to provide a higher level of PE teaching within the school.

'Real PE' Scheme has been identified to best meet the needs of the National Curriculum and training has begun to integrate this scheme to work alongside our existing school schemes. It has been trailed successfully in a Year 1 and 3 class for a term and the next wave of training is due to take place in June.

'Real PE' is fully aligned with the National Curriculum and Ofsted requirements, focusing on Agility, Balance and Coordination and Healthy Competition.

Summary

The staff have given good feedback about the training they have had, especially with the 'Real PE'. This will be begin to be rolled out gradually up through the school beginning with EYFS and Year 1 at the start of the next academic year.

Next Steps

1. To continue to provide Staff with evaluation forms to assess the impact of PE training.
2. To provide the staff with opportunities to share good practice they have learnt with other members of staff e.g. staff meetings, peer coaching sessions.

To increase participation in School Sport Competition

Affiliation with the South Northants and Daventry School Sports Partnership (SNDSSP) and the Northampton Town School Sport Federation (NTSSF) have provided the school with range of intra (against other schools) competitions.

98 pupils (21%) have competed in intra school competition in the following competitions:

- A range of Year 4, 5 and 6 football competitions
- Year 5 and 6 Cricket competitions
- Year 2 mass event Multi Skills Festival
- Year 6 Tag rugby Competition

- KS2 mass event Cross country competition
- Year 5 and 6 Netball Competition

Funding has also been used to pay for coaches to transport children to mass participation events.

Summary

The amount of children participating in intra sports have increased from 62 to 98 children since last Year. Mass participation events have contributed to a greater amount of children being able to get involved in intra competition.

Next Steps

- 1) To enter a wider range of intra competitions, catering for more children.
- 2) To provide children with greater opportunities to participate in inter (within school) competition as a way into intra competition.
- 3) Pupil interviews to determine impact of participation in intra competition.
