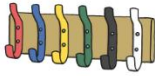


## Welcome To Moulton Primary School Foundation Stage

### PE:

Each class will have one indoor P.E. session a week in our school hall. RA P.E. sessions will be on Monday mornings, RB P.E. sessions will be on Tuesday afternoons and RC P.E. sessions will be on Wednesday mornings. Our P.E. sessions may begin the week your child starts school fulltime. Your child will need to bring a kit to school for this session. Each child will have a peg where they can leave their kit. Our cloakroom space is limited in all classes so we ask that the children bring their kit in small back packs or bags. These will be sent home at the end of term to be washed. Please can we ask that you label your child's P.E. kit and school uniform to ensure that items do not get lost.



### Your child will need:

Black shorts.

Their house coloured t-shirt.

Plimsolls.



### School uniform:

We like to see all of our children looking smart in their uniform. Full details of our school uniform are enclosed in the school prospectus.

In brief, the uniform is a royal blue sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan and a blue or white polo shirt, all with the school logo. For the boys, grey or black trousers and for the girls, the option of a grey skirt or pinafore dress. In the summer girls may wear a check gingham dress and in the winter grey or black trousers are permitted. Sensible shoes should be worn, trainers are not allowed.



### Jewellery:

The only jewellery we allow in school are ear studs. For safety reasons these must not be worn on days of PE. At the beginning of term you will be advised of the days each class has P.E. If your child wears ear studs please ensure they are removed on these days. Members of staff are not allowed to remove such items of jewellery.





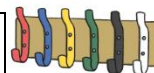
### Book bags:

Each child will be given a school book bag (donated by FOMPS) when they start school. The children will have the opportunity to bring home a book from our book corners. When your child is ready they will be given a guided reading book, which they share in a group and will bring home to read along with an individual levelled reading book. From day one you will also find in your child's book bag a reading record book. This is used by the class teacher to record when your child reads in class and to explain what they did. We also want you to feel free to record any reading activities you complete with your child in their record book, such as sharing their school or home books. All of these will come home with your child in their books bag.



We also use your child's book bag to send home work completed in class and any communication which is not emailed.

We ask that your child's book bag is brought into school each day.



### Home School book:

Each child will be sent home with a home school book. This will be a small exercise book which we use to communicate with individual families. Feel free to use as you wish. Examples of how to use these will be written in the front of the book.



### Snack:

All children in the foundation stage and KS1 receive a portion of fruit daily. We encourage children to bring a sports style drinking bottle containing **water** which is kept at an easily accessible place in the classroom so that children are able to take a drink during the day.



Children under 5 are entitled to free milk at school. Arrangements for this are dealt with directly by **Cool Milk At School Ltd** and you will be given a form on which to claim this entitlement. When your child reaches 5 years of age they can continue to receive milk but you will be charged for this directly by the company. Any enquiries about milk at school should be directed to **Cool Milk at School Ltd**.



### Show and Tell

As the children begin full time schooling we would also like to encourage the children to participate in class show and tell. At the start of each term you will receive a topic letter which will provide an overview of the learning which will take place each term. We then ask that show and tell is topic related and supports the children's learning journey. For example during the Autumn term we will be learning about 'Ourselves' - My Body - growth, Healthy living, Families etc. Therefore related show and tell could consist of family photographs, baby books, x-rays, growth charts etc. We look forward to sharing more information about our coming topics with you on Tapestry and through our topic letters.
