Our topic will lead us to discover the oceans of the world and we will be using atlases to locate them.

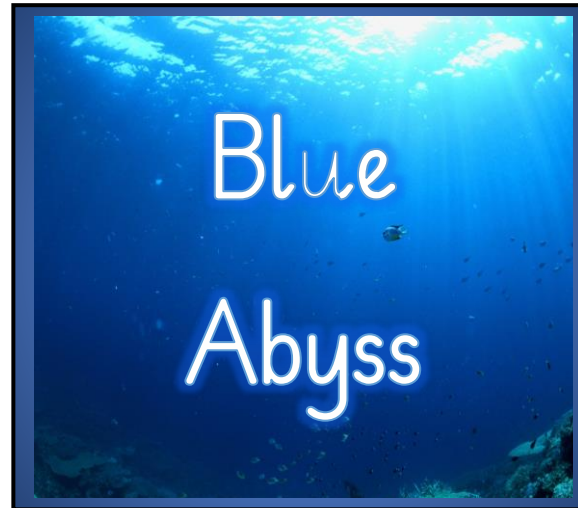
In addition, we will consider the environmental impact of tourism on the Great Barrier Reef.
